
- A fence permit is required for any new wood privacy fence with a height of 5 feet or more. The permit fee is \$25.
- Use galvanized steel pipe for the vertical posts (not //wood), set in a concrete footing at the appropriate depth for the height of the fence.
- Leave at least one inch between the ground and per the bottom of your fence.
- Be sure to check that fence panels and horizontal stringers on your wood privacy fence meet the minimum dimensions required by ordinance.
- The finished (flat) side of your fence should face outside your yard to the street and neighboring properties. The stringers and posts should be on the inside of your fence.
- If you are replacing or repairing an existing 6-foot tall fence, a fence permit may not be required.
  Determine the total linear footage of the fencing on your property. If your repair or replacement is less than half of that total linear footage, you won't need a permit.
- A fence over 6 feet in height ALWAYS requires a fence permit (no matter what type of fence). The maximum height for a residential fence is 8 feet.
- If you are using a fence contractor to build your fence, be sure the contractor checks with the City for specific construction regulations that apply to your property.


